WATER & SEWER COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES May 9, 2023

Attendance:

Chairman Tom Dwyer, Commissioner Marc Nickerson, Commissioner Scott Pim BOS Rep. Tom Gauthier, W&S Administrator Dennis Koch

1. Call to Order:

Chairman Dwyer called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM in the Epping Town Hall.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag followed.

Motion by Chairman Dwyer to seal the non-public minutes of 5/9/2023. Seconded by Commissioner Nickerson. Motion carried 3-0.

- 2. Approval of Minutes: Motion by Commissioner Nickerson to approve the minutes of 4/4 & 17/2023 as submitted. Seconded by Commissioner Pim. Motion carried 3-0.
- 3. Appointments: Dave Mercier of Underwood Engineers gave an update:
 - WWTF Phase II Short-Term Improvements Membrane Replacement
 - CAP Update
 - Town is ahead of schedule with CAP items
 - 2nd new Zenon train has been purchased and is under production
 - Install of first Zenon train has been awarded to RMM; quote for install of second set is pending BOS approval
 - Bids are opening for the membrane enclosure at 2 PM on 5/18 at WWTF
 - Train 2 membranes have all been cleaned and the train is processing 107,000 gpd
 - Today four cleaned modules were installed in Train 3 and put online; 2 more will be ready and installed in Train 3 by end of the week
 - Over the next 2 weeks all six remaining membranes will be cleaned and installed in Train 1
 - Bypass will restart to draw down the lagoons on Thursday 5/11; will need to run for 2-3 weeks until cleaned membrane capacity exceeds influent flow
 - RMM is under contract to install heat trace on MLSS recycle line
 - To comply with Sept 30 CAP items, UE needs to finalize RFP documents for insulation of MLSS recycle line, new alkalinity feed system in Headworks Building, and EPFSS
 - o New AO Update
 - Town responded to draft AO with comments last week; revised draft sent by EPA end of last week; did Town provide a final response?

- WWTF Lagoon 1 and 2 Sludge Removal
 - O Synagro plans to remobilize the week of May 15
 - O Their proposed schedule has them fishing sludge removal from both lagoons this year but also requires them to process 4X more material per month than they did last year
 - O They have provided an updated submittal on equipment layout that we have sent to DES
 - O They plan to restart in Lagoon 2 and will want water in the lagoon to be 3-4 feet of freeboard
- MtBE Watermain Extension
 - o MtBE project is going full tilt with Granese running 3 crews at once
 - O UE/Granese/Town meeting every Friday now to discuss next week's work areas and how to handle traffic, etc.
 - O Mainline pipe installation is ahead of schedule and expected to be complete mid to late Summer 2023
- Other
 - O CAP requires adding MPE50 to aeration tanks; need to acquire a second 55 gal drum. Cost is \$2548
- **4. Administrator's Report:** Dennis Koch requested the following abatements... \$178.48 for 290 Calef Hwy.,Unit A28 and \$303.78 for 38 Moore Street.

Motion to approve the two abatements made by Commissioner Nickerson. Seconded by Commissioner Pim. Motion carried 3-0.

5. Commissioner's Reports:

Chairman Dwyer: Thanked SP for the brochure work. Apologized to the Tax Collectors office for the sewer rate increase causing a flurry of phone calls. Stressed to residents that sump pumps are not allowed t be connected to the sewer system.

Commissioner Nickerson: Confirmed the we currently have two job openings posted. One is an entry level position and the other is for a Chief Plant Operator.

Commissioner Pim: SP read a statement regarding the \$100K ARPA grant to conduct a total nitrogen reduction study. After reviewing the two proposals, Underwood Engineers was chosen.

Motion by Commissioner Pim to award the job to Underwood Engineers. Seconded by Commissioner Nickerson. Motion carried 3-0.

Dave Mercier thanked the Board and clarified the scope of work: The project will include sampling and analysis of the influent, provide two different choices of treatment (no membranes as primary), and include a 30% design of the chosen process, allowing for an accurate cost estimate.

The next steps will be final design, bid for construction and a Warrant Article of March of 2024.
